- ChinaAMC Select Greater China Technology Fund (the "Fund") will invest primarily in China-Related Technology Companies and in the opinion of the Manager, will likely benefit from innovations, use of new technologies or offering products and services that meet the demands of the new and evolving China economy ("China-Related Technology Companies"). The Fund may invest a small portion of its assets in fixed income securities, equities listed on stock exchanges around the world other than the Greater China, other collective investment schemes and invest directly in Mainland China securities.
- The Fund will invest in equity securities and is subject to general market risk and the prices of such securities may be volatile
- The Fund may also invest in companies of any market capitalization including but not limited to companies with small or medium market capitalization. ▲ Investment Objective

The Fund seeks to achieve long term capital growth by primarily (i.e. not less than 70% of its Net Asset Value) investing in China-Related Technology Companies (as defined below). To achieve the investment objective, not less than 70% of the Fund's Net Asset Value will be invested in equities of technology companies which, in the opinion of the Manager, will likely benefit from innovations, use of new technologies or offering products and services that meet the demands of the new and evolving China economy ("China-Related Technology Companies") with registered offices located in the Greater China area (including Mainland China, Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan), and/or China Related Technology Companies that do not have their registered offices in the Greater China area but either (a) carry out a predominant proportion of their business activities in Greater China or (b) are holding companies which predominantly own companies with registered offices in Greater China.

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


▲ Manager's Comment


The Hang Seng Tech Index fell 3.24% in November, as the market continued to retreat due to the impact of Trump's election as President of the United States and the lack of large-scale incremental stimulus policies in the consumer and real estate sectors by the Chinese National People's Congress Standing Committee in November. On November 6th, Trump secured at least 270 electoral votes and declared victory in the 2024 presidential election. In his victory speech, Trump praised the Republicans for controlling the Senate, stating that the U.S. had given them "unprecedented strong authorization." On November 13th, President-elect Trump nominated Florida Republican Senator Marco Rubio as Secretary of State, former Democratic Congresswoman Tulsi Gabbard as National Intelligence Director, and Florida Republican Congressman Matt Gaetz as Attorney General. On November 25th, President-elect Trump announced a 25% tariff on all products entering the U.S. from Mexico and Canada, and a 10% tariff on all goods imported from China. With short-term Chinese domestic stimulus policies not significantly exceeding expectations, external risks have become the focus of investors.

Looking ahead, investment managers maintain a positive outlook on the market's medium to longterm performance. With Trump's election as President of the United States, short-term investors' concerns about geopolitical risks have risen significantly. Coupled with China's delay in introducing large-scale demand-side incremental stimulus policies, market risk appetite is low, leading to recent overall outflows of overseas funds. From an internal fundamental perspective, China's financial and economic data for October showed overall improvement. Recent micro liquidity has improved, and the trend of significant credit contraction has eased. Core CPI has slightly improved year-on-year, and total retail sales of consumer goods have exceeded expectations. However, investors remain focused on the sustainability of economic recovery and subsequent policies. On November 19th, the Chairman of the China Securities Regulatory Commission, Wu Qing, stated at the Third International Financial Leaders Investment Summit, "Long-term investment, short-term investment, we welcome both, but what the market needs now is to unclog the blockage for long-term capital to enter the market," which had a positive impact on market sentiment. It is expected that the downside space will be limited after the previous retreat, with a focus on the statements on subsequent incremental policies at the December Political Bureau meeting and the Central Economic Work Conference. Data on the flow of foreign funds from some foreign banks shows that the proportion of global long funds allocated to the Chinese market has fallen to the low level of June. If more positive policies are introduced subsequently, investors' low expectations and low positions may drive a significant rebound. Funds will continue to adopt a relatively positive investment strategy, while continuing to enhance the grasp of alpha opportunities at the stock level in a complex market environment, enhancing the diversity and stability of portfolio investment returns.
